Sweet alyssum (<i>Lobularia maritima</i> ,* annual)	Lettuce	Sweet alyssum is attractive to the syrphid flies and parasitic wasps whose larvae feed on aphids.
Flowering herbs in the carrot family (Apiaceae), such as dill , fennel (<i>Foeniculum vulgare</i> ,* Zones 4–9), and cilantro	Various vegetables	Members of the carrot family are especially attractive to many types of non-stinging parasitic wasps that use caterpillars to feed their developing young.
Plants in the daisy family (Asteraceae), such as cosmos , black-eyed Susan , and sunflower (<i>Helianthus annuus</i> , annual)	Cole crops	Members of the daisy family support many beneficial insects that dine on aphids, including ladybugs, lacewings, parasitic wasps, and more.
